## **MEDIA ALERT**

Imagine holding the same job for 30 years without ever once receiving a raise. If that job required you to pay for many of the associated costs of doing business, inflation alone would have significantly decreased your take home pay. Regardless of the profession, the quality of the work being performed under such a financial arrangement will always be questioned.
