UW Colleges & UW-Extension Host Preserving Pathways: A Neighborhood Conversation Series

MADISON, Wis. - Over the past 50 years, much of the country's population—and especially the Midwest—has been shifting further away from rural areas, opting for urban and suburban settings instead. This trend causes a negative ripple effect across communities and industries. As the population declines, local businesses face a reduced available workforce, funding for school districts decreases, fewer classes are offered to students, and access to quality healthcare grows restrictive.

To address these critical issues and help provide innovative solutions, UW Colleges and UW-Extension are partnering with Northern Wisconsin communities, organizations and government agencies to host Preserving Pathways: A Neighborhood Conversation Series. The series of three roundtables—held May 30 in Rice Lake, May 31 in Marshfield and June 1 in Marinette—will focus on the topics of education, healthcare and the economy. UW Colleges and UW-Extension Chancellor Cathy Sandeen will facilitate the discussions.

Education is the first topic in the series of conversations, as rural schools face many unique challenges including declining enrollment, growing poverty, staff shortages, insufficient broadband service, higher transportation costs and an increased number of English Language Learners. Access to quality healthcare is the next topic in the series. This is a critical factor in job creation. It's also an important topic for young families deciding where they will make their home and for senior citizens deciding where to spend their retirement. The rural healthcare workforce needs to expand, considering only 13% of the state's primary care physicians practice in rural Wisconsin, resulting in roughly one physician per 2,263 residents. The economy is the final topic in the series of conversations. Rural Wisconsin is home to an excellent workforce, but demographic trends demonstrate many people raised in rural areas are leaving to seek opportunity elsewhere. This ultimately discourages new providers of family-supporting jobs from locating outside of urban or suburban areas, and restricts opportunities for those who remain. Furthermore, the skills gap has become increasingly challenging in rural communities. Panelists include:
