The Wisconsin Library Association (WLA) applauds the Joint Finance Committee's unanimous approval of an additional \$1.5 million investment in state aids to Wisconsin's 382 public library locations.

The Joint Finance Committee made an important investment in public library services by approving increased funding for a budget line item that supports new technology resources and enhanced services in the areas of broadband access, workforce development, and lifelong learning.
