



Wisconsin Physicians Boost the State's Economy

New study demonstrates that physicians support more than 150,000 jobs, generate \$25.8 billion in economic activity

January 10, 2018 - Physicians add opportunity, growth and prosperity to the Wisconsin economy by creating 151,072 jobs and generating \$25.8 billion in economic activity, according to a new report, *The Economic Impact of Physicians in Wisconsin*, released by the Wisconsin Medical Society and the American Medical Association (AMA).

"Physicians make a difference in the lives of the patients and families they care for every day," said Wisconsin Medical Society CEO Bud Chumbley, MD, MBA. "And while the value of that physician/patient relationship is immeasurable, this report brings to light the added impact physicians have on Wisconsin's economy—an impact that is enormous."

The study quantifies the economic boost that 12,598 active patient care physicians provide to the state's economy, producing a ripple effect that is felt statewide. The study measures physicians' impact using four key economic indicators:

- **Jobs:** Physicians support 151,072 jobs in Wisconsin–an average of approximately 12 jobs per physician.
- **Economic activity:** Physicians generate \$25.8 billion in economic output, comprising 8.5 percent of Wisconsin's economy. On average, each physician generates \$2 million for the state economy.
- Wages & benefits: Physicians contribute \$13.3 billion in total wages and benefits paid to Wisconsin workers, empowering a high-quality, sustainable workforce. On average, each physician contributes \$1.1 million to workers' wages and benefits.
- State and local tax revenue: Wisconsin physicians' contribution to the state economy generates \$1.2 billion in state and local tax revenue for their communities—translating to \$96,630 for each physician on average—enabling community investments to be made.

"The positive impact of physicians extends beyond safeguarding the health and welfare of their patients," said AMA President David O. Barbe, MD, MHA. "The Economic Impact Study illustrates that physicians are woven into their local communities and have a vital role in fueling state economies by creating jobs, purchasing goods and services, and supporting public services through the tax revenue they generate."

The report found that every dollar applied to physician services in Wisconsin supports an additional 94 cents in other business activity. An additional 6.8 jobs, above and beyond the clinical and administrative personnel that work inside the physician practices, are supported for each \$1 million of revenue generated by a physician's practice.







Across the country, physicians add \$2.3 trillion to the U.S. economy, support more than 12.6 million jobs nationwide, contribute \$1 trillion in total wages and benefits paid to U.S. workers, and generate \$92.9 billion in state and local tax revenue.
