Early voting is available until Friday August 10. Check with your your municipal clerk on early voting locations in your community. Some towns and cities, like Madison, have early voting in public libraries

Voting Reminders

Some other key points to remember when voting:

- You have the right to. vote privately and independently
- Accessible polling place with voting machines for voters with disabilities are required.

As a voter with disabilities you may:

- 1. Seek assistance from workers at the polling place who have been trained to use the accessible voting machine or
- 2. Bring someone to help you vote
- 3. Request curbside voting if you cannot enter the polling place due to a disability on Election Day.
