Governor Walker proclaims Nov. 5-11 as Startup Wisconsin Week

Second annual initiative includes 150+ events in 12 cities to assist startups, promote entrepreneurship

- Kenosha: Eisley Creative records will air a live episode of their "Be Original" podcast before a studio audience on Nov. 5. Guest Matt Cordio, founder of Startup Wisconsin, will discuss the statewide initiative.
- Madison: The Wisconsin Technology Council's <u>Early Stage Symposium</u> on Nov. 7-8.
 More than 600 people are expected to attend the conference, which will provide startups with a chance to engage with angel and venture investors from Wisconsin and beyond.
- Beloit: <u>The Beloit Startup Showcase</u> event on Nov. 5 will feature five companies located in the Irontek co-working space pitching and participating in Q&A. The event also will include networking, live music and tours of Irontek.
