The groundbreaking ceremony of the American Legion Family Cabin will commence at 1:00 pm at the build site located at Thrush Road in the Town of Lake Tomahawk. Tours of Camp American Legion will be given before the event starting at 11:00 a.m.

The American Legion, Department of Wisconsin Commander, Frank Kostka is thankful to The American Legion Family and others who have helped make this cabin possible, "The American Legion Riders have been contributing to the National Legacy Scholarship fund for some years now, providing scholarships to children of parents who lost their lives protecting our country. With changing needs and priorities, I and our membership wanted to keep this year's State Fundraising Ride to help Veterans and families in our State. With the necessary demolition of an old cabin, the new American Legion Family Cabin became a natural replacement. The opportunity for this cabin aligned with our mission and became my new goal.
