WI Supreme Court Rules Actions by Evers Administration to be Unconstitutional

This evening the Wisconsin Supreme Court struck down the unconstitutional actions taken by Governor Evers' administration, which had extended the Safer at Home Order. All businesses can reopen immediately unless there is a local health department order prohibiting it. In response to the action by the Supreme Court, Representative Tyler August (R-Lake Geneva) released the following statement:

"I was thrilled by the ruling issued by the Supreme Court today. It was clear that the actions taken by Governor Evers' administration were unconstitutional and had to be checked.
