REP. HINTZ STATEMENT ON REP. CROWLEY'S FINAL DAY IN THE STATE ASSEMBLY

MADISON – After becoming the first African American County Executive in Milwaukee County history, Representative David Crowley (D-Milwaukee) is stepping down from his Assembly seat as of Thursday, June 18. Assembly Democratic Leader Representative Gordon Hintz (D-Oshkosh) released the following statement on Rep. Crowley's last day in the State Assembly:

"David is a natural leader who stepped up immediately in the legislature as a tireless advocate on issues important to his constituents. In his two terms, he pushed me, our caucus, and the entire legislature, to truly put racial disparities at the forefront of decisions being made. He has never shied away from confronting the complicated issues often ignored. David openly embraces the responsibility that comes with serving in public office and is determined to make a positive difference in people's lives.

"While we will miss his voice in the Assembly, I'm excited to work with him in his new role as Country Executive."

Representative David Crowley is a lifelong resident of the City of Milwaukee. He was elected in 2016 to the Wisconsin Assembly representing the 17th Assembly District and serving the neighborhoods and the constituents he has known his entire life. Most recently, Crowley served on the following Assembly Committees: Criminal Justice and Public Safety, Small Business Development, Workforce Development, Transportation, and Jobs and Economy.
