Brad Pfaff Announces Economic Plan to Invest in Middle Class

Pfaff plan on job training and affordable health care earns support from working families

ONALASKA - With Labor Day approaching and the national economy in upheaval, Wisconsin Senate candidate Brad Pfaff announced his plan to invest in working families and grow the middle class.
