Participants will consider ways to not only attend to students' deep conceptual understanding of mathematics, but also to students' agency, competence, and identities as mathematicians and humans.

"Not only are we focused on math teaching that builds students' deep conceptual understanding of mathematics through equitable math discourse practices, but we are also looking at students' mathematical thinking," Christina Stefonek, Math and Science Professional Learning Specialist, explained. "In addition to those things which have been researched for a long time and considered the best practice in math teaching, we consider the humanity of the people in the room who are doing the math."

The *Math Equity Project* is a one-week online summer institute followed by online monthly meetings on weeknights during the 2021–22 school year for continued



collaboration. This course can be taken for three credits or for non-credit professional development.
