Anti-Voting Measures Have No Place in Wisconsin Every Voter Deserves Equal Access and Equal Opportunity at the Voting Booth

MADISON – Today, the Wisconsin State Assembly met in regular session to pass numerous bills designed to motivate legislative Republicans' far-right supporters and undermine the right to vote in Wisconsin. In response to today's session, Rep. Greta Neubauer (D-Racine) released the following statement:

"I am deeply disappointed by Assembly Republicans' recent actions regarding our electoral process. Today's bills are a continuation of Republican attacks on our democracy, working to suppress voters and limit access to elections just to motivate their far-right fringe supporters.

"This is part of a national partisan scheme that threatens to make it harder for voters to participate in our democracy. Disability rights advocates, faith leaders, and business leaders across Wisconsin have made it clear that these anti-voting measures have no place in our state.

"The changes Republicans pushed through the Assembly today will make our elections less accurate, less secure, and less accessible for Wisconsin voters. We should be working to ensure that every voter has an equal opportunity to participate in building a brighter future in Wisconsin.

"Republicans are wasting the public's time with anti-voter legislation when they should be working to ensure Wisconsinites have the resources they need to bounce back after COVID-19. Our students need more support than ever after a difficult school year, but Republicans are committed to under-funding K-12 education. We have a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to use one-time federal resources to address critical needs in education and our communities and transform our state's future. I won't stop pushing for better for our state, and I hope my Republican colleagues will stop the partisan games and join me."
